New EJC special issue Stopping cancer in its tracks: metastasis as a therapeutic target Published May 2010, Volume 46, Issue 7

Guest Editors: Patricia S. Steeg (Laboratory of Molecular Pharmacology Center for Cancer Research, National Cancer Institute, USA) and Jonathan Sleeman (Institute of Toxicology and Genetics, Heidelberg University, Germany)

Despite many years of basic and clinical research aimed at curbing tumour growth, metastasis remains the prime reason why cancer patients succumb to their disease. Effective translational research is urgently required, yet it is not always easy to achieve. This special issue reviews the reasons why metastasis as a disease process has proven difficult to control, and suggests ways in which translational research in this area can be strengthened and advanced.
